YEAR SIX SATS AND SHERINGHAM INFORMATION SESSION

YEAR FOUR MULTIPLICATION TIMES TABLE CHECK (MTC)

By the end of year four, children should know all times table facts up to 12×12 . To check this key objective, there is a requirement for all children in year four to sit a multiplication test (MTC). This is an electronic test with 25 random questions that children must answer within 6 seconds.

Year four will sit the MTC at the start of June.

To help your child prepare, please ensure they practise their times tables regularly over the coming weeks. They can do this through TT Rockstars (the Soundcheck Game mirrors the MTC) or by using the paper sheets they bring home.



YEAR FOUR SWIMMING

Children are expected to be able to swim 25 metres by the end of Year Six. To support them to achieve this goal, children from year four will be attending swimming lessons next term. The swimming lessons will start on **Thursday 18th April** and end on **Thursday 27th June** at Waendel Leisure Centre.

IMPORTANT SAFETY MESSAGES

A polite reminder that children and parents should **not** cut through the school car park when entering or leaving Apple Tree Club. Instead, the path running around the perimeter of the building should be used. Although it is inviting to use the short cut to save time, it is very dangerous.

This week there was a near miss when a member of staff was leaving the carpark. Fortunately, she saw the parent and child just in time, but was very shaken by the situation.

When dropping off your child at the junior school in the morning, please be mindful of where and how you park. Pulling up to park on the pavement on the busy Wellingborough Road is dangerous and restricts the width of the pavement for pedestrians.

Thank you to everybody for helping to keep our school community safe.

One of the main aspects that was mentioned in the infant survey regarding what we could do to improve was linked to our mixed age teaching in Year 1 and 2. We are pleased to share with you that from September, Year 1 and 2 will be taught in single year group classes for the whole day for at least the next two years. We hope to be able to sustain this beyond

two years, but it is vital that we maintain a high pupil intake in reception, to make this financially viable. Please keep recommending us to your friends!

Another parent suggested that we have more parent volunteers to hear children read. We always welcome volunteer readers and if this is something you are interested in, please contact the school office. We follow our safer recruitment processes for volunteers, so an application form would need to be completed and we would seek references and apply for a DBS certificate before volunteers help in school. Once this process is completed, it is a very rewarding opportunity.

HEAD LICE

We are aware of a few cases of head lice in school and would be grateful if you could check your child's hair over the weekend and regularly thereafter. Please treat if you find any lice.

When children's hair is checked regularly, head lice become less of a problem.
