READING WITH PARENTS



The Daylight Centre strive to help people in Wellingborough and the surrounding districts of North Northamptonshire in meeting a huge range of personal challenges, including homelessness. The Foodbank is designed to help individuals and families who are in crisis by providing those in proven need with basic food and other essential items for a short time until the crisis is resolved or until the appropriate agencies are in a position to assist. We hope you will agree that this is a very worthwhile cause, helping people who need support in the local community.

To ensure that essential, non-perishable items are donated, the centre ask for donations, which are indate from the following list only

- 750ml squash (in urgent need)
- Tins of custard (in urgent need)
- Tins of fruit (in urgent need)
- Long Life Milk (UHT or powered)
- Long Life cartons of fruit juice
- Pasta Sauces
- Anything tinned, for example tomatoes, beans, vegetables or soup
- Biscuits or Snack Bars
- Rice
- Tea or Coffee
- Chocolate


